





CONSTRUCTION UPDATE FOR WEEK OF JUNE 5-11, 2020 NM 68-US 64 ROADWAY PROJECT – PASEO DEL PUEBLO IN TAOS

NOTE: All construction is weather permitting and subject to change without notice.

Update as of Thursday, June 4, 2020


Construction is continuing on Phases 1A & 1-A2 of the NM 68-US 64 Roadway Project on Paseo del Pueblo from La Posta Road north to Camino de la Placita in Taos. Construction is expected to last until late 2021.

During Phase 1-A (see map to right):

- Crews are working in the medians of NM 68/Paseo Del Pueblo Sur from La Posta Road/Cervantes Street north to Tewa Street/Albright Street.
- At least one lane of traffic is open in each direction (north and south) in the outside lanes.
- Left-hand turns are restricted for intersections of Paseo Del Pueblo Sur with La Posta Rd./Cervantes St. north to Tewa St./Albright St.

Phase 1A2, Extended to June 8-10, 2020 (see map below):

The intersection of NM 68/Paseo Del Pueblo Sur at La Posta Road/Cervantes Drive is <u>CLOSED ONLY</u> to left-hand turns in all directions of the intersection. Northbound and southbound travel through the intersection can continue as usual, permitting right-hand turns only.



During this closure, traffic may use detours as needed:

- Traffic on Paseo Del Pueblo south of the intersection will be detoured east on Cruz Alta Road, then north on Gusdorf Road, then west on Albright Road to access Paseo Del Pueblo.
- Traffic on Paseo Del Pueblo north of the intersection will be detoured west on Tewa Street or east on Albright Road.
- → Traffic detoured west on Tewa Street will head south on Zuni Street, then west on La Posta Road, then north on Salazar Road, then east on Siler road to access Paseo Del Pueblo.
- → Traffic detoured east on Albright Road will head south on Gusdorf Road, then west on Cruz Alta Road to access Paseo Del Pueblo.

ACCESS IS BEING PROVIDED TO ALL BUSINESSES.

Regular work hours are **Monday-Friday 7 a.m.-5:30 p.m.** although crews may work longer hours or on weekends if needed.

Motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians traveling in the construction zone are encouraged to expect delays and give themselves extra time to reach their destinations.
